

## Research-based Learning and Public Scholarship

Research-based learning (RBL) has been shown to engage students and motivate staff as it brings together the key strands of learning, teaching and research. This workshop will provide you with techniques for linking your teaching and research to enhance student learning. You will also learn about the connection between RBL and public scholarship when you and your students address research problems in community settings. Scholarly activity generating new knowledge through academic engagement with community issues is increasingly important as universities are being urged to demonstrate their relevance and contribution to finding answers to pressing social problems. The workshop will feature a panel of academic staff who will share their experiences and strategies for engaging in RBL and public scholarship at Griffith.

This workshop would be particularly beneficial for academics who have a WIL or community engagement dimension to their curriculum. It would also be useful for Program Convenors and Course Convenors who are considering embedding RBL or public scholarship in their curriculum.
