

Achieving Teaching–Research Connections: Launching New Resources and Ideas

The seminar, will discuss findings from a national Carrick Institute funded project on connecting teaching and research at the academic, faculty and institutional levels. The project, entitled *The Academic's and Policy-Maker's Guides to the Teaching-research Nexus: A suite of resources for enhancing reflective practice*, is a collaboration between the University of Melbourne, Griffith University and the Queensland University of Technology.

The seminar features:

- An interactive workshop with **Professor Mick Healey**, Director of the Centre for Active Learning, University of Gloucestershire.
- New resources to assist in linking teaching and research, including the launch of the new website www.trnexus.edu.au
- A discussion of issues and opportunities for linking disciplinary research with teaching.

The seminar will be highly relevant to academic staff with an interest in connecting their research and teaching, as well as to leaders of learning and teaching and those responsible for developing programs that include research-based approaches to learning and teaching. Heads of Department and Deans are also encouraged to attend as there will be discussion about ways to reward and recognise academics, who effectively link research and teaching to enhance student learning.

Professor Mick Healey is an internationally recognised scholar with more than 100 publications on various aspects of teaching and learning in higher education. He has acted as an advisor to the UK Higher Education Academy and is a co-author on the recent publication "Linking teaching and research in disciplines and departments".
